## Who's who for Tonight's Oscars

HOLLYWOOD (UPI)—The 37th annual Oscar jamboree tonight will be largely a contest between a pair of musical females—"Mary Poppins" and "My Fair Lady."

Both leading ladies will be in Santa Monica Civic Auditorium at 7 p.m. PST (10 p.m. EST) for the show-down.

Julie Andrews, who played the title role in Poppins, will be there as a nominee for best actress.
